

ALWAYS USE TAHOMA 12 FONT Please submit in .doc or .docx format

Events/Fundraisers

- ⇒ You can begin posting for your event two (2) months prior to the event. Please include the date, time, location, cost and if the event is a fundraiser who is it benefiting.
 - It will be posted under "Save The Date".
- ⇒ To assure the event is posted one (1) month before, please consider sending a reminder or resend the event.
 - It will be posted under "Next Month".
- ⇒ The month of the event: Please consider sending an email to <u>golflakesbanner@gmail.com</u> with a reminder to put the event on the calendar.
 - It will ONLY be on the CALENDAR.
- ⇒ PLEASE keep in mind, if you miss any of the deadline dates feel free to utilize the Golf Lakes Friendly Resident Facebook page. Even if you don't miss a deadline, you are welcome to remind residents up to three (3) weeks prior to the event.

Miscellaneous Changes

Since the Banner is published a minimum of four (4) weeks in advance, it has been decided by the committee to utilize the Golf Lakes Friendly Facebook Resident Page for items like scores for games, cards, winners of golf leagues, pickleball leagues, lawn bowling events, etc.

We feel residents would rather see and hear about an event when it happens rather than 4+ weeks later.

The same thing is true when you have summer gatherings – take photos and share photos on our Facebook page. Let everyone enjoy them soon after they happen.

Manager's Report



Happy 2025 Golf Lakes! Where did 2024 go? Seems to me that although Hurricane Milton made time stand still for a bit, the resilience of man made the clean-up and continuing recovery efforts to speed up the time continuum.

It's election time next month and you should have your voting documents this month....assuming we have candidates. At this writing there are only two people running for the three open positions!

With the budget and Special Assessment behind us, we will now focus on maintaining or reducing costs along with strategic planning for the future.

We now have an Ad-Hoc Committee working on a full scale disaster plan incorporating all of the learnings from Hurricane Milton. We continue to look at aging infrastructure and plan for improvements to ensure Golf Lakes runs smoothly for many years to come.

With only minor inconveniences during the transition to the new gate software and knowing all the work that went into it behind the scenes, it was relatively smooth and successful. With this change, Golf Lakes will have the opportunity to scale the system and incorporate access to both the Clubhouse and the pool/gym using the same platform as needed in the future. More advanced options such as RFID tags are also an option to reduce the time it takes to gain access at the gates . The Safety Committee will continue to research and consider ways to improve the overall performance of the systems available including how to reduce tailgating, unauthorized access by outsiders, and speeding within Golf Lakes.

Let's make 2025 the best year ever! If you haven't had an opportunity to attend a <u>Coffee and Conversation with the Manager</u>, the next one is scheduled for January 7, 2025 at 10:00 am in the Conference Room. See you there.

The Many Forms of Communication within Golf Lakes

1. **The Banner** is the official print media for communicating events and clarifying policies/rules. Groups can submit items and are responsible for the veracity of their items. The Banner can not be as timely as it would like because of the publication scheduling and printing. A useful portion of The Banner is the centerfold. Many residents detach this and post it on their bulletin board (or the world's most common art gallery, the refrigerator). Each month, The Banner is available in the Clubhouse. It is also available via the web site golflakes.com (look under the "Residents" tab. Past issues can be accessed there as well).



2. **Email blasts** are sent through the Park Manager/Office when events such as Pool Closures or Gate issues need to be announced. Residents should verify that the Office has their correct email address. This method of "getting the word out" is careful to not be overused. If you are not receiving these notices, check your spam. Because this method tries to be as timely as possible, residents should tag the sender as trusted.



3. The Golf Lakes Official Resident Facebook Page is another method of communication for our Residents. To join the page you need to submit a request to become a member of the private group. All members are required to answer questions and will be verified with the Park Office. The moderators approve all posts submitted to make sure they meet the guidelines as dictated by the Board of Directors. It is a wonderful source of information as well as recommendations.



4. **<u>Bulletin Boards</u>** are located within the Clubhouse. There are dedicated Boards which both inform, capture sign-ups for various events such as Activities, Board of Directors Notifications, Potlucks/Pitch-ins and opportunities to be involved within the community. Residents are encouraged to "check out" the multitude of groups, activities, and opportunities for service and enrichment.



5. <u>Saturday Morning Social Hour</u> is often the most interesting method of receiving notices. The announcements segment features individuals expressing events in their own personal style. A chair on Saturday morning costs one dollar. Donuts can be purchased, or you can bring your own refreshments. The advantages of attending Saturday Morning are: you are hearing from the proverbial horse's mouth and you can ask for clarification.



Please be very cautious about information transmitted by "word-of-mouth". The recent events of Hurricane MILTON have demonstrated how inaccurate "somebody said" information can be. Do you remember the "Telephone Game" from elementary school?

In 1965 as the cows grazed in the open field on 53rd Street, 18 women met and formed The Women's Club of Golf Lakes.

Ann English became the first President. The dues were set at 10 cents and have now risen to \$1.00 per meeting.

They also adopted this Creed For Living which is still recited at each meeting:

"Keep us, O God from pettiness; let us be large in thought, in word, in deed.

Let us be done with fault-finding and self-seeking.

May we put away all pretenses, meet each other face to face, without self-pity and without prejudice.

May we never be hasty in judgement and always generous.

Let us take time for all things, grow calm, serene, gentle.

Teach us to put into action our better impulses, straight forward and unafraid.

Grant that we may realize it is the little things that create differences and in the big things of life we are as one.

And may we strive to touch and to know the great common human heart of us all, and O Lord, let us not forget to be kind."

Today the Women of Golf Lakes continue to assist in many ways within the park, contributing gifts of time and money where needed. Within the last 10 years, almost \$50,000 was dispersed in Golf Lakes in addition to various needs in the neighboring community.

"There are no buts in the Bylaws."

Series by Tom Drooger, Banner Committee

It has been a couple months since an article was published concerning the Bylaws due to the rude interruption of not one but two Hurricanes. Our thoughts go out to all who are still suffering the Impact of the storms. We as a community have banded together to support each other. A special thanks to the Board of Directors and our fantastic Park Manager as they guided us through the storms.

This month we will feature: Vehicles, Traffic and Trailers.

As stated in the Bylaws:

IX. VEHICLES, TRAFFIC AND TRAILERS

- Speed limit for all vehicles is fifteen (15) miles per hour.
- 2. Pedestrians, bicycles, golf carts, and motorized wheelchairs shall always have the right of way.
- 3. Vehicles that are not in operating condition, have tags that have not been renewed or that have no license tag displayed may be towed at the owner's expense.
- 4. Residents shall park their vehicles on their own driveway and shall not park on the streets overnight. If all available parking space is occupied on one's driveway, visitors and guests may park at the end of the cul-de-sac (provided there is one on their street) but shall not block adjacent driveways.
- 5. No utility trailers, motor homes, campers, truck campers, converted buses, <u>or</u> originally manufactured vans equipped with water tank <u>or</u> supply hose <u>or</u> 110 electrical hookups <u>or</u> furnace <u>or</u> sewer hookups shall be permitted in the Park at a residence for more than eight (8) hours. Such vehicles are never to be used for sleeping-over purposes in the park.
- 6. Residents or visitors with utility trailers, motor homes, campers or travel trailers shall park the same in the designated area in the North parking lot (providing space is available) for no longer than seventy-two (72) hours within a ten-day period.

Owners must post the address and phone numbers (on the vehicle) of the resident using the North lot for parking. Vehicles will be towed at the owner's expense.

- 7. No campers, travel trailers, or motor homes shall make use of the South parking lot at any time
- 8. Any person who owns or operates a golf cart in Golf Lakes shall have liability insurance on said cart and shall assume all liability for driving it on Golf Lakes premises.

No person under the age of sixteen (16) shall operate a golf cart in or on the streets of the park.

- 9. No trucks owned or operated by residents of the Park may exceed one ton in capacity and must be a pickup style or type.
- 10. Canoes, kayaks, paddle boards, surf boards and jet skis are allowed if stored in an enclosed solid structure; e.g. under mobile home, in shed or garage.



Stargazing News to kick off 2025

January gives us the first of many celestial events to enjoy this year. With the beauty of the night sky and the excitement of a new year get inspired to stargaze in 2025.

January 1st Quadrantids Meteor Showers start to be seen on the 1st and continue until the 5th. On the 3rd night the showers will be at peak (40 meteors per hour). You will have better viewing due to dark skies. Find a dark location after midnight and start looking for big bright fireballs.

January 10th Venus will be at its highest point above the horizon in the evening sky and will be very bright in the western sky after sunset. Venus will be brighter than the stars and will not twinkle as only stars twinkle.

January 13th will give us the first full moon and due to the moon's position, its full face will be fully illuminated. Early Native American tribes called this the Wolf Moon as they would hear hungry wolves howling outside their camps.

January 16th Mars will be at its closest approach to Earth and its face will be fully illuminated by the Sun. Mars will be visible all night long and will be its brightest of the year.

January 22th a planetary alignment occurs after sunset with Mars, Jupiter, Uranus, Neptune, Venus, and Saturn. This alignment is also called a Planet Parade. Neptune and Uranus will need to be viewed with a telescope but the rest will be bright enough to be seen with the naked eye.

January 29th a new Moon will be on the same side of the Earth and Sun but will not be visible in the night sky allowing for viewing of other celestial objects such as galaxies and star clusters.

There are two Apps you can download on your phone allowing you to point your phone to the sky to find planets, constellations, satellites, and other objects. The APP gives information on what you pointed at and how you can view them. Download the App Sky Tonight, Starwalk 2 or download both for even more information. Stay Bright and Twinkle.



SPOTLIGHT ON COMMITTEE SERIES—BUDGET & FINANCE

With Apologies to Lewis Carol . . .

... The time has come the Walrus said to speak of "Grasshoppers and Ants". The Aesop's fable speaks about the difference (and consequences) of planning or the lack of it for times ahead.

Here at Golf Lakes we have a diligent committee of ants who watch out for our best interests. In expenditures, there are two schools of thought. One method of spending looks for bargains, makes a purchase and spreads the payments over a period of time. For the privileged of buying now, the lender charges a lending fee which ultimately increases the cost of the item purchased. Another method puts funds aside in preparation for the purchase. The funds set aside for the future earn interest until used. The Finance and Budget Committee positions our assets in the manner of the second method through a system we refer to as "reserves". Each annual budget funds both the immediate costs such as labor and equipment and positions the association for future expenditures which can be anticipated.

Resident co-op owners are apprised of the budget each year around November 1st through printed copies that are either retrieved from the Office or are mailed to the address on record for the unit. While less than exciting reading, the data was carefully accumulated into a financial plan. This hard-working committee is charged with an almost clairvoyant task of not only seeing costs 12 to 15 months in advance, but also allowing for the unimaginable events such as this fall's Milton. Their findings are communicated in detail at an all resident Communications Meeting in early December.

As owners (and prospective buyers) describe what separates Golf Lakes from many of the surrounding communities is the financial health which is the direct result of the Budget and Finance Committee. Regardless of any individual concerns, the overall product of the Budget and Finance Committee is to be commended.





The Days of Auld Lang Syne

"Auld Lang Syne" meaning "old long since" or the modern meaning "for old times sake" can be traced back to 1648 during the Scottish Reformation Era, when Puritans and Presbyterians restricted Christmas festivities that were considered superstitious and indulgent for the puritan people. Although the Christian celebrations were banned, the coming of the New Year was celebrated by way of a winter festival. The Scottish people call this celebration "Hogmanay".

In 1788 "Old Lang Syne" was written by Scottish poet Robert Burns. Burns got his inspiration from a poem dating back to the 1600's by poet Robert Aytoun. Between 1600 and 1700, Aytoun's poem was sung in different melodies throughout Scotland communities until song writer James Watson used the poem to form a folk ballad. This ballad was sung to celebrate passing of friends and the beginnings of the new year.

Robert Burns sent his poem to the Scottish Musical Museum because he felt the previous ballad was mediocre. He worked with composer James Johnson and came up with a compilation which Johnson published but the words of the poem were rewritten. In the 19th century, the song was rewritten by George Thomson who made a compilation that was closest to the poem Burns wrote. This song became the traditional song of the Scottish people for Hogmanay.

Guy Lombardo, a famous bandleader, helped to make the song "Auld Lang Syne" a New Year's Eve tradition here in the United States. In 1929 Lombard had a popular radio broadcast and had his band play the song just before the turning of the New Year. He continued this event for over 30 years. Lombardo's version is played in Times Square every New Year's Eve right after the drop of the ball.

The first recording of the song was played in 1898 on a Phonograph cylinder (created by Thomas Edison) used to demonstrate the new technology. You can hear this recording online through the British Library Sound Archive website. To hear a beautiful rendition of "Auld Lange Syne" look up Rod Stewart singing the song. You will hear bagpipes in the background along with other famous singers joining in.


Even though the song does not mention New Year's Eve, the song makes us reminiscing of the previous year and it gets us excited for the year to come. There is controversy as to what the lyrics to the song mean. A note was found from the 1800's. that was thought to explain Old Lang Syne—On the approach of twelve o'clock, a hot pint was prepared with a spiced infusion of spirits. When the clock had struck the knell of the departing year, each member of the family drank this mixture with a generous handshake and a dance around the table singing the song. Author unknown. Happy New Year!





A little history about Quilts of Valor

Quilts of Valor was started in 2003 by Catherine Roberts. Her son was deployed in Iraq at the time. She had a dream...she pictured a soldier sitting on his cot hunched over and appeared to be in utter despair. Then like watching a movie, her dream picture changed to a soldier wrapped in a quilt and his demeaner changed to one of hope and well being. So to Catherine, the dream meant a Quilt equaled Healing, and Quilts of Valor was born.

What is a Quilt of Valor? It is a quality handmade quilt that is machine or hand quilted. It is awarded to a Service member and says unequivocally "Thank You for your Service and sacrifice in serving our nation." To use the term *Quilt of Valor*, the quilt must be a specific size, must have a label with required information and it must be awarded. It must meet these requirements and then it must be recorded. There is data base that holds this information for all Quilts of Valor in the United States.

Golf Lakes Quilters made a Quilt of Valor and donated it 3 years ago. It was given to a service member in a very moving ceremony in Ellenton. Because of this, our quilt group in Golf Lakes decided to have our own ceremony each year to recognize and award our quilts to Golf Lakes service members. Our lady quilters decided that the fairest way to select recipients receiving a Quilt of Valor each year, would be by age. Maintaining an updated list of service members in Golf Lakes and choosing 10 folks each year is an ongoing task. Not all service members are interested in participating in this ceremony, therefore we select the oldest members first and call them to confirm they would like a quilt.

Our next ceremony will be January 18, immediately following Coffee Hour with retired Master Sargent Air Force Tammy Arnold from Lakeland, Florida presenting these quits. Tammy has ladies who do the actual long arm quilting to finish these quilts while the ladies at Golf Lakes put all the tops and pieces together. We take donations to purchase the fabric for these quilts and many of the ladies use their own money to make them. Our group purchases the 108" wide backing for the quilts and the ladies make the pillow cases for each quilt for storage. Tammy Arnold's ladies does the quilting and adds the batting and label. We send Tammy money to help defer her costs of batting and thread. The time and love making these quilts are always free.




