Manager's Report



Happy Spring. Tax Day and the April 15 deadline for being under contract for any remaining hurricane repairs is fast approaching. Be sure you have provided the office with your plan and/or contractor's name, preferably in writing and to the following email, tracy@golflakes.com.

If you need any assistance with repair arrangements, please don't hesitate to call the office. If you have a home that is being removed, remember you or your contractor must apply for a "take service" from FP&L which will remove the meter and ensure the electricity is off and safe for the home to be removed. Also, before removing, notify the office so that the water supply can be capped to avoid any water and sewer lines being damaged. All new homes must make sure the new home is not installed over any existing water and sewer lines. All old clay or cast iron piping need to be replaced with PVC prior to the arrival of the new home.

While we have had quite a bit to recover from, don't forget the basics like ensuring your home is clean, painted if needed, and your landscape well maintained, with an overall neat and tidy appearance.

If you plan to leave for the summer, **ALL** outdoor items must be put away before you leave the park. Be sure to check out with the office, so we know where to send mail that we have for you, and provide contact information on who is watching your property and entrusted to treat weeds and perform any needed maintenance.

Let's finish the season strong. I enjoyed meeting so many new residents during our Coffee and Conversations with the Manager, and I plan to continue and look forward to meeting many more of you.

This month we will feature: RECREATION FACILITIES.

C. SHUFFLE RULES

- 1. There shall be no shuffleboard played after 10:00 p.m.
- 2. A park resident must accompany all children under 18 years of age on the courts and follow rules of play on score sheet.
- 3. The shuffle discs and other equipment may not be loaned or taken to other facilities.
- 4. Golf Lakes' discs only may be used on courts.
- 5. Sweep and bead courts before using.
- 6. No open toe shoes on courts.
- 7. No food or drink on courts.
- 8. No walking on courts.

D. GOLF COURSE RULES

- 1. Only Golf Lakes residents and their guests are permitted to play.
- 2. Guests under age 18 must be accompanied by an adult 18 years or older, and follow rules of play shown on scorecard.
- 3. The golf course is reserved Monday through Thursday for league play.
- Signs designating "Women/Men League using Executive Course" will be posted during the applicable times.
- 5. Tees not to be used as a driving range when other golfers are present.
- 6. Repair all ball marks on greens.
- 7. Repair all divots.
- 8. No golf carts allowed on Golf Lakes Executive Golf Course.
- 9. Residents will enforce the rules.
- 10. Flagrant abuse will result in loss of playing privileges.

E. PICKLEBALL RULES

- 1. The Golf Lakes Pickleball Club has reserved court times (See Schedule).
- 2. Sports shoes are required. No flip-flops.
- 3. Only pickleball paddles and balls are allowed.
- 4. Food is not permitted, drinking water only.
- 5. Roller blades, skates, skateboards and bikes are prohibited.
- 6. During open resident play, limit play to 30 minutes if others are waiting.

- 7. Courts are open from 7:30 a.m. until 10:00 p.m.
- 8. Guests under the age of 18 must be accompanied by an adult over 18.
- 9. Paddles and balls are available at the Fitness Center.
- 10. Use of courts is at your own risk. The Golf Lakes Residents Association and The Golf Lakes Pickleball Club assume no liability for injuries or accidents.

F. POOL & HOT TUB RULES/NOTICE

There is no Lifeguard on duty... Use the Buddy System.

Pool hours: 7 a.m. – 10 p.m. Daily (except on cleaning days).

Pool Capacity: 40; Hot tub Capacity: 9; (max temp. 105)

No one under the age of 12 is allowed in the hot tub.

Persons 12 to 18 allowed in the hot tub only under the supervision of an adult.

- 1. Shower before entering pool or hot tub. (STATE LAW)
- 2. Guest using the pool/spa must be in-house guest unless accompanied by a resident.
- 3. No animals in pool /pool deck or hot tub.
- 4. Drinks in covered unbreakable containers allowed 4 ft. from pool/hot tub edge.
- 5. No food or ALCOHOL BEVERAGES inside the pool or hot tub area.
- 6. Bonafide bathing suit only.
- 7. No diving or jumping in pool. No diving or jumping off shoulders or throwing of another individual is allowed.
- 8. No running on pool deck.
- 9. Anyone under the age of 18 must be accompanied by a person 18 years or older who is responsible for their safety.
- 10. No one with open sores or band-aids allowed.
- 11. Only suntan lotions allowed. (NO OILS)
- 12. Body lotion must be washed off before entering and re-entering pool or hot tub. (Lotion creates a scum line and will clog the filter system.)
- 13. A towel must be placed on lounge when using lotion.
- 14. Furniture must not be removed from pool deck area.
- 15. No radios unless used with earphones.
- 16. Only noodles and water weights are allowed. Life saving equipment may be used if fastened to the body.
- 17. Children 6 months or older, accompanied by parents or grandparents, are allowed to use swim diapers in the pool.

- 18. Management can deny pool privileges if pool rules are violated.
- 19. Radios permitted for exercise classes.
- 20. Any person using the pool facilities shall obey the lawful rules (approved by the Board of Directors) pointed out by residents.

G. FITNESS CENTER RULES

- 1. Everyone should consult a physician prior to using any Fitness Center equipment, which includes the sauna.
- 2. Only residents, employees and overnight guests, 18 years and older, are authorized the use of the Fitness Center equipment.
- All other guests must be accompanied by a Golf Lakes resident.
- No one under the age of 12 years old is allowed to use any Fitness Center equipment.
- 3. If you are the last person to leave the Fitness Center, all lights and fans should be turned off.
- 4. Do not wear wet swim suits when using Fitness Center equipment.
- 5. Fitness Center equipment should be wiped dry after each use.
- 6. Do not change plugs or attempt to fix any malfunctioning equipment.
- Report any problems to the park office or to any member of the Fitness Center committee as soon as possible.
- 7. Fitness Center or swimming pool users have priority use of Fitness Center showers.
- 8. Bicycles shall be parked in the provided bicycle rack.
- 9. If another person is waiting to use the equipment, usage is restricted to thirty (30) minutes.
- 10. Equipment or supplies can not be removed from the Fitness Center, except for pickleball paddles and balls.
- 11. Residents are responsible for ensuring that their guests comply with these rules.

H. FISHING RULES:

- 1. Fishing is permitted in all lakes.
- All guests under 18 years of age fishing in the lakes must be accompanied by an adult 18 years or older at all times.
- Anyone fishing must meet state licensing requirements.
- Fishing is catch and release only. Fish caught in the lakes should not be eaten.




ACTIVITIES COMMITTEE – VOLUNTEERS NEEDED




April 1st begins the new season for the Activities Committee.



SPRING INTO ACTION FOR THE GOOD TIMES AHEAD

The season is winding down for many of us and it is time to think about preparations for closing our home. Florida weather can be brutal on a home especially during hurricane season and anything we do now can lessen the chance of problems next season.

- Here are a few suggestions before closing your home.
- Check your gutters and make sure they are clear of any debris.
- Inspect doors and windows, check weatherstripping and caulk, repair as needed.
- If you suspect any problems with the roof, have a professional check it before you leave.
- HVAC should be checked to make sure it is clear of any debris. Test AC on Humidistat setting for reliability. Annual inspection and cleaning by a professional are recommended.
- Algae, mold, or any discolorations on the home should be cleaned with products made for these issues.
- Check clam shells, make sure hinges are secure and bolts are tight.
- If using any propane tanks, check for leaks or corrosion.
- Outdoor furniture and décor should be washed, dried, and stored away.
- Check your shed. Address any issues that could cause problems to items being stored. Any
 chemicals should be closed tight and safe from spilling. Rags used with chemicals should be
 thrown away.
- Have the home treated for insects. It is recommended that Florida homes be treated quarterly. If you see any signs of critters contact pest control right away.
- Security of your property should always be considered. Management asks that you leave yard lights on while you are away, so check sensor and bulb. Having exterior motion sensor lights can be an inexpensive way of adding security. Cameras have come down in price and with Wi-Fi these cameras can be installed inside and out allowing you to monitor your property on your smart phone or tablet. Buy "camera in use" window stickers and place where they can be seen.
- Giving the inside of your home a thorough cleaning helps reduce the chance of mold and helps deter pests. Go crazy with the vacuum in every room.
- Cover furniture with clean sheets. Avoid dryer sheets on furniture as chemical coating can yellow or stain.
- Wipe down the kitchen with a mild vinegar and water solution. Clean all counter appliance. Clean dishwasher per manual, wash drain filter.
- Clean refrigerator with vinegar solution. Clean drip pan. Prop doors open.
- Discard perishables in cabinets. Clean inside cabinets where needed.
- Wash trash cans.
- Clean bathroom with products that kill mold. Discard plastic shower liner. Wash fabric curtain.
- Run washer on small cycle with a cup of vinegar. Leave lid up. Clean dryer filter and block vent to keep pests out.
- Using desiccants like Damp Rid in the home to reduce moisture should be placed in cabinets and closets. Place where they cannot be knocked over and check containers for cracks.
